



Restrictions on client attendance in group interventions may occur as result of the client's behavioral presentation. Treatment service delivery should be adjusted to the client's level of behavioral appropriateness. Some parameters for group may be:

1. Clients must have reasonable attention and concentration to participate in the group treatment setting.
2. Clients must take medications as prescribed (no self-alterations of administrations).
3. Clients may not "advertise or boast" about their medication regimes to other clients.
4. Clients may not give or sale, or offer to give or sale, any medications to other clients.
5. Other clients in groups may be removed for "attacking or berating" clients who are taking prescribed medications.
6. Clients who are not behaviorally appropriate for groups should be seen individually, until they can participate in the group process.
